#### **VHDPA Criteria for assessing grants:**

The objects and purposes of the VHDPA are:

- (a) To further the interests and welfare of the community of the Village of Hall and District; and
- (b) To protect and progress the amenity and character of the Village of Hall.

The VHDPA's primary financial responsibility is the maintenance and upkeep of the school site and pavilion as these are, in turn, the source of funds for the association.

The VHDPA is not primarily a fund raising entity. Nevertheless, surplus funds may be distributed in response to requests which are assessed using the following criteria.

Project/purpose:	Computing for seniors
Amount sought:	Exploring future funding options
Relevant dates:	Ongoing running of the Hall Computing for Seniors Kiosk
Summary:	Currently the VH&DPA receives \$360.00 from Adult Learning Australia to provide internet access for the Kiosk, however this is not enough to cover our needs. Hall Rotary have matched this amount and it enables us to have 8 gig per month downloads/uploads. Computer updates being what they are in this day and age we often find we have exceeded our quota within the first two weeks of the month. This greatly impacts on our ability to teach Computing to Seniors. We currently have a mobile plan with Telstra. I would like the opportunity to propose that we return to a fixed line with another provider for about the same amount that we are currently spending. Our needs are about \$840.00 per year, less the \$360.00 we receive from Adult Learning Australia leaving a short fall of \$480.00 per year.
Other information:	Computing for seniors is a free service with minimal funding from Adult Learning Australia to provide computer learning to seniors
